## RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. No entry fee will be charged to the children.
2. Competition in the Elmvale Junior School Fair is open to elementary and high school students, as well as those children receiving home instruction in our area.
3. The grade the pupil is in, when the project is completed will determine the class in which it is to be entered.
4. All exhibits in competitive standing of the pupils for entry must be the property of the exhibitor.
5. Articles exhibited in any previous year will not be awarded a prize.
6. Pupils must not make more than one entry in any one Section.
7. All exhibits should be in place, and arranging of school displays completed by 7 p.m. Thursday, October 6th. Livestock should be on the grounds by 10 a.m., Friday, October 7th, and removed at 4:30 p.m.
8. Entry forms and tags will be given to the teachers prior to the Fair.
9. Entry tags must be securely tied or fastened to the exhibit. See specific regulations for art, penmanship etc..
10. Exhibits, except livestock, **not to be removed until 4:30 p.m.** Saturday October 8, 2011, but must be removed by 5:00 p.m.
11. Anyone found guilty of willfully breaking the rules of the Fair will forfeit all prize money won.
12. Entries **must** be the work of the pupil.
13. Plates will be supplied for vegetables. Exhibitor should supply **disposable** plates for all baking entries.
14. All entries must be completed since last Fall Fair.
15. **Home Instructors:** In all categories that are pre-judged by classroom teachers, i.e. Printing, these entries must be in the hands of L. Murray c/o O.L.O.L.

by 9:00 a.m. September 30. Please include a telephone number. They will be pre-judged by a committee - **best 3** for all Printing and Writing categories (representation by population)

**ANNOUNCEMENT TO PARENTS:** Parents are urged to allow the children to do the work and preparations of the exhibits without assistance (unless otherwise noted). Encourage them in every way, but remember that every bit of work you do for them helps to defeat the object of the Junior School Fair.

Points are accumulated as follows: 1st prize - 4 points, 2nd prize – 3 points, 3rd prize - 2 points, 4th to 10th prize - 1 point. In case of a tie, the trophy will go to the person with the most first prizes. At least 50% of the total points must be accumulated in Sections 1 through 232 inclusive.
